

Cindy is an original member of the Gamma Epsilon Chapter. Gamma Epsilon split from Lambda in 1994. Cindy has been an active contributor to Gamma Epsilon. Besides attending meetings, she served on the Scholarship Committee for many years and continues to serve on the Personal Growth and Music Committees. Cindy taught Kindergarten and/or Developmental Kindergarten for thirty-four years in the Ogdensburg City School District. She served on numerous professional committees including



curriculum development, Middle States and committees to develop Pre-first, Developmental Kindergarten and the After School program. Cindy also served as a mentor and sponsor teacher. Despite her professional demands Cindy found the time and energy to be involved in her community. Tim Vernsey, Superintendent of Ogdensburg City schools announced at her funeral that the newly constructed cafetorium and playground at Kennedy School will be named in her honor. He also proclaimed that the Advantage After School Program will be changed to the Betty J. Mallott After School Program. Betty Mallott will be missed, but not forgotten.
